The invitation to the Conference is not restricted to Berkeley alumni. It is open to the entire membership of our organization and the German-American legal community. If one asks German scholars or students at which law school in the US they would most like to teach or study, Berkeley consistently figures in the top ranks amongst the answers. Our conference will allow prospective students or visitors to get a first-hand impression of the UC Berkeley campus, the academic community and, of course of San Francisco and the entire Bay Area.
